One local resident, with little to no computer knowledge, came to the library looking for help in creating a resume. Building digital skills

Libraries across the country provide critical connectivity to high speed internet access and computers—a service which can be especially important in rural communities where broadband access still lags. According to BroadbandNow, just 58.6% of Millard County residents have access to high-speed internet—the fourth-lowest percentage of all counties in Utah. Delta City, meanwhile, has less than 61% broadband coverage. In comparison, 95.6% of Utah residents as a whole have access to high-speed wired broadband.

Many people visit the Delta City Library to use the library's broadband network

and to receive help using digital devices or to navigate online tools, digital services, and applications for programs like Medicaid and
