RESOLUTION

The following resolution was passed with five abstentions. It was agreed that this resolution be released to the local press with the request that it be posted in the SRRT's Action Center.

Whereas we are opposed to the Vietnam war and its extension into Cambodia; and

Whereas we support the Cooper-Church amendment;

Whereas we are opposed to the expansion of the military-industrial complex;

The librarians meeting in Philadelphia voted to endorse the Curley/Alfred Aconda Intellectual Freedom Study Report included in the Newsletter. Its adoption by the Association in support of the report on the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances was passed.

Be it resolved that ALA resolve to dedicate 1% of its total budget to the support of intellectual freedom and to create an Intellectual Freedom Subcommittee Report to be submitted.

Be it resolved that SRRT advocate that ALA/ALA Liaison to the Association funds be allocated at least in part to the Freedom to Read Foundation.
