Whereas Ms. Crawford was an active member of the American Library Association (ALA)'s Government Documents Round Table (GODORT), serving on numerous committees throughout her career and as Advertising Editor for *DttP: Documents to the People*;

Whereas she provided support and leadership for the Technical Report Archive & Image Library (TRAIL), a project providing free public access to digitized technical reports issued by Federal agencies prior to 1976;

Whereas she encouraged the development of expertise in government information through her work with the Houston Area Network of Documents Information (HANDI);

Whereas Esther Crawford shared with her colleagues and friends her incisive and energetic problem-solving, her warm sense of humor, and her tireless support and compassion for those in need; and

Whereas her dedication to the role of technology in creating and supporting access to government information resources was a source of inspiration to others in the community; now, therefore, be it
